

News and Updates from around the school on issues around inclusion, equality and diversity

This week our Diversity Ambassadors have been working together to bring you this page for the newsletter. Our Diversity Ambassadors have attended their second Diversity Workshop where they have been discussing untold stories, issues affecting our school, meeting with our Sixth Form leaders and how they can affect change in Ravens Wood School.

What have the students been learning?

Our students were split into three groups this week, all working on researching different civils rights movements, these were; Racial inequality, LGBTQ+ rights and Women/Gender equality, Ableism and many more. Below are some topics of discussion our group raised. In our most recent session, our ambassadors have been working on creating their own Ready to Learn content for the rest of the school to take part in. The themes for this week were:

- Use of gender neutral terms in other languages, examples used were German and French
- Brenda Howard the "Mother of Pride" and how her work influenced the Bisexual community
- How can schools act more effectively to prevent and protect students from harassment and bullying?
- How can Ravens Wood still have a uniform policy that still inhabits the ethos of the school, but allow for expressions of individuality?

A Christmas Themed look at Racial Equality

It's the 1980's. And, like every child, the protagonist of O Boticário's video released in 2020 loves Christmas. Keen-eyed, the boy takes in a variety of thematic images, including those in his own home, and notices that they all point to a similar depiction of Santa Claus. "So many Santas out there and no one looks like me?" reflects the boy. Fast-forwarding to 2020, the story tells that the things he ever wished for and believed in have made all the difference. He is now the protagonist not only of this story but also of the celebration of love among all peoples: he is a Black Santa Claus.

This is the story behind the video featuring in a host of initiatives of Brazilian cosmetics and perfume brand O Boticário to celebrate Christmas. The commercial also gets people to think about the importance of believing in our own dreams. "We have a robust diversity strategy and we'll keep building on it, well aware of the challenges ahead. As Brazil's most beloved beauty brand, we see that our role is to promote and appreciate plurality among people", says Alexandre Bouza, head of O Boticário.



For years O Boticário is a brand with a direct approach to racial equality, including diversity in their commercials and productions. This time has been no different. In sync with a number of initiatives and commitments of the company, we aimed at an inspiring story with the emotion the season demands. We're telling the story of young black child who just wanted to feel represented in the figure of Santa Claus - a figure that has lately (and fortunately) been more diverse in public spaces, Christmas specials, and content actions," says Pernil, executive creative director at AlmapBBDO. It is vital to remember that PPE1 is a starting point. It is normal to see a dip in comparison to End of Year 10 grades. The PPE exams cover the entirety of GCSE specifications and are very rigorous. If students respond positively they will make lots of progress between now and their Summer exams. Please remain positive with your son.

Please continue to encourage your son with 100% completion of homework and all students should now be in a routine of revision and retrieval through the use of flashcards and GCSEPod. Keep quizzing your son on key content so he can test his knowledge!!

Free School Meals/Pupil Premium Payments are available to all eligible pupils attending Bromley maintained schools.




Year 7 Birthday Celebrations

THE PHYSICS OF SANTA CLAUS

Calculations maintain that the laws of physics should prevent Santa Claus from delivering all his gifts and that Santa would burn up in the atmosphere if he tried.

Every Christmas, these calculations circulate that have been dubbed "The Physics of Santa Claus". The calculations cast doubt as to whether Santa Claus could possibly deliver gifts to all the world's good children – and still remain within the laws of physics.

If Santa Claus is to deliver all the gifts to all the good children, his sleigh must fly so fast that he would burn up due to air resistance. But it has already been documented that Santa has no problem climbing down a chimney with a fire burning below. So how does Santa solve the problem of heat?


