As we approach the final week of the spring term, there is much to reflect on and celebrate. A letter has been shared with families today outlining arrangements for the last day of term, along with key dates and information for the summer term ahead. I encourage all families to take note of the details as we prepare for the final and most significant part of the academic year.

Since our last newsletter, we've welcomed back our Duke of Edinburgh Silver participants from their practice expedition, as well as our Senior French Rugby Tour group from their experience in Biarritz. Both trips were fantastic opportunities for our students to grow in confidence, independence, and team spirit.

On Tuesday 18th March, our Spring Concert offered a showcase of the exceptional musical talent we have here at Ravens Wood. From soloists to ensembles, the evening celebrated creativity, dedication, and the power of performance—our students did us proud.

We've also been delighted to host our German Exchange visitors, who have spent time shadowing their counterparts around school and exploring London and the local area. A huge thank you to the families who have made them feel so welcome.

There have been several sporting fixtures recently, but a standout moment came on Thursday 20th March, when our Year 9B football team beat current National Champions Richard Hale School 3–2 in extra time. The boys have now secured their place in the National Final at West Bromwich Albion in May —a phenomenal achievement.

Our Year 11 students had the opportunity this week to watch a powerful one-man performance of Jekyll and Hyde, deepening their understanding of the text as they prepare for their English Literature exams. Alongside this, they and their families joined us last night for their final Parents' Evening of the year—a vital moment to reflect on progress, target revision priorities, and prepare for the fast-approaching exam season.

The last two week's assemblies have again been inspirational: Mr Hunt spoke to students about the International Day of Happiness, reminding us all of the importance of positivity, gratitude, and community. Mr McCartney and Miss Hollingsworth led an insightful assembly on Women's History Month, celebrating the achievements of women past and present, and encouraging all students to reflect on equality and empowerment.

Our Jungle Book production rehearsals continue to gain momentum, with students showing real commitment and energy as they bring the story to life. Meanwhile, our musicians took part in the Bromley Schools' Proms at the Fairfield Halls on Tuesday, performing pieces from Les Misérables with professionalism and passion—they truly stole the show!

These subject-specific revision sessions, led by our expert teachers, are designed to support students as they finalise their preparation for the summer exams. 

RAVENS WOOD U18 RUGBY TOUR

The Ravens Wood U18 rugby squad recently embarked on an unforgettable tour to the Basque region of France, continuing a proud tradition that has spanned over 30 years. Based in Anglet, a coastal town perfectly positioned between the rugby powerhouses of Biarritz and Bayonne, the team immersed themselves in high-level rugby, Basque culture, and some unforgettable experiences both on and off the field.

The Basque Country, straddling the French-Spanish border, is renowned for its strong rugby heritage, breath-taking landscapes, and deep-rooted traditions. With clubs like Biarritz Olympique and Aviron Bayonnais playing a major role in French rugby history, it was the perfect setting for our Rugby Academy to develop their skills against some of the best.



The squad faced two tough fixtures during the week. On Wednesday evening, we took on Dax U18 in a competitive match that pushed us physically and tactically. Despite our best efforts, Dax secured the win, but the experience gave us insight into the fast paced, offloading style of rugby that is engrained into Basque players.



On Saturday afternoon, we stepped up against a very strong Biarritz Elite Crabos U18 side, one of the top youth teams in France. The game was a huge test, exposing us to the high-intensity, structured style of elite-level European rugby. While the result didn't go our way, the players gave a good account of themselves and Louis Trace picked up two sneaky tries from the base of the ruck.



A major highlight of the tour was a training session led by former Biarritz first-team player Elvis Levi. His insights and expertise provided a fantastic learning opportunity for the squad, helping sharpen skills and deepen their understanding of the game.





The team was also incredibly fortunate to meet French rugby legend Serge Blanco, a World Rugby Hall of Famer and one of the greatest fullbacks of all time.

Beyond the rugby, the tour provided plenty of opportunities to experience the Basque lifestyle. The squad took part in a surfing session along the famous Atlantic coastline, where they swapped rucks and scrums for waves and wipeouts! They also explored the beautiful cities of Biarritz and Bayonne, taking in the rich culture, historic architecture, and

vibrant atmosphere of the region.



This tour also had a special meaning for several members of staff who share a long history with the trip. Mr. Freds and Mr. Beaumont first attended the Basque tour in 2011, beginning their connection with this long-standing tradition. Mr. Pillow was also part of the 2011 tour, but as a Year 12 student and a key member of the 1st XV squad. Assistant Head Mr. Hunt's ties to the tour go back even further as he attended the tour as a pupil in 1998.

CROSS-CURRICULAR HISTORY LESSON ENGAGES A-LEVEL GERMAN STUDENTS

On Thursday, 27 March, Mr. Tysall—Ravens Wood's Head of History and Politics and IMPACT Trust Lead for History and Politics—delivered a thought-provoking, cross-curricular history lesson for A-Level German students.





Conducted entirely in German, the lesson explored the nature of the East German dictatorship, prompting students to grapple with ethical questions surrounding totalitarian regimes. They debated whether the German Democratic Republic (GDR) could justifiably be described as a Fürsorgediktatur—a so-called "benevolent welfare dictatorship."


Students also examined the Parteilichkeitsprinzip, the principle that required East Germans to align their thoughts and actions with the ruling party's ideology. They gained insight into the extensive surveillance methods of the Stasi (East Germany's secret police), including the extraordinary practice of collecting scent samples to track citizens.











Reflecting on the lesson, Mr. Tysall praised the students' engagement and analytical skills: "I was incredibly impressed with their thoughtful and reflective approach to these challenging topics. Their ability to deconstruct abstract German concepts and discuss them fluently was truly remarkable."

Mrs. Jackson-Man, Head of German, echoed this sentiment, commending students for their "intellectual curiosity and linguistic proficiency."















Mrs. Hemming and Miss Abbott took the KS5 Art classes to the University of Westminster to participate in the Photography Insight Day. Students had the opportunity to use their photographic studios as well as participate in a book/zine making workshop!











The day really inspired these future creatives in their endeavor to break into the creative industry by exploring the facilities of the University of Westminster and understanding the potential future they could have at an Art-based university.



YEAR 11 CAREER SUPPORT MEETINGS




