Why is this topic being studied at this time? How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?	In Mexico, crafts created for practical purposes and folk art are a valued part of the national identity and history. Such work is influenced not only by Mexico's indigenous people and culture, but more recently European techniques and designs. In this term, students will build on their Formal Elements baseline knowledge and foundation skills they began to develop in Year 7. Students will start to link contextual references, starting to recognise cultural characteristics of the work of Mexican Folk artists and how to manipulate techniques to form their own personalised designs.
