Architecture is both the process and the product of planning, designing, and constructing buildings or other structures. Architectural works, in the mate form of buildings, are often perceived as cultural symbols and as works of art. During this term, the emphasis will be on students developing their creating through problem solving, by being given a brief and guided technical skill instruction on a variety of techniques and materials — with an emphasis on equipping them with skills for their futures as Artists, Designers, and Craftspeople. Students will explore the theme of Architecture by studying contextual sources such as the work of Spanish architect Antonio Gaudi and his distinctive addecorative world heritage sites.
