



Subject: Year 8 Term 2 – Chez moi/ en ville – what can you do around town?

Overarching Topic: Home Town – what can you do around town?			
<p>Why is this topic being studied at this time?</p> <p>How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?</p>	<p>By Y8 pupils should have a range of linguistic tools in their arsenal to be able to read, listen, speak and write in two foreign languages and in French lessons they describe where they live – a relatable topic through which pupils can describe their own worlds. This yields plenty of opportunities to explore the culture of French-speaking countries as we look at the geography and where time allows the history of certain towns. With this topic, students will consolidate and develop their range of adjectives and opinions they can use to describe their town / own world and can justify why they give opinions on where they live, which will bring language learning and the French language they are learning to life!</p> <p>Students will continue to develop their knowledge of the future tense that was introduced in Term 1. More able students will be able to use a wider range of modal verbs, as well as different ways of justifying their opinions.</p>

Can I describe them in French? Can I understand what life is like in French-speaking countries?</p>
