Subject: French Year 9 Term 3

Overarching Topic: Theme 1: Identity and Culture (Customs and Festivals)

Why is this topic being studied at this time?

How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?

Pupils will now consolidating all the knowledge and skills they have acquired over the Year 9 course. Students will consolidate their mastery of three time frames, developing increasing spontaneity in their spoken and written responses. The highlight of this term will be the creation of a cultural project framed around the francophone world – traditions, food, geography and leisure activities. The term and the year will end with pupils completing a Theme 1 speaking document, where pupils will have worked on and extended their own responses for the oral GCSE exam.
