



Subject: Year 8 Art

Module 2 – Day of the Dead

Overarching Topic: Cultural festivals and similarities and differences around the world.

Why is this topic being studied at this time?

Following from the theme of Mexican Folk Art in Module 1, students will now investigate a number of cultural festivals and the similarities and differences that are shared between them. Students will be specifically investigating the Mexican Festival of Day of the Dead, which has been added to the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?

Students will look at American and European influences, misunderstandings between other celebrations and influences on storytelling in television programs and blockbuster films. Students will experience a range of cultural influence to build upon the knowledge from the first half-term.
