<p>Why is this topic being studied at this time?</p> <p>How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?</p>	<p>The purpose of this scheme of learning is to introduce students to the current make-up of the UK and the impact this has on citizens. This scheme of work also introduces students to the vast benefits of living in a diverse and multicultural society, whilst also introducing students to the issues raised by these developments. This allows students to begin to understand the changes in UK society over the past century and the impact this has had on modern-day beliefs and values.</p> <p>Joining up: The topic builds from the topic on British Values, namely around tolerance, individual liberty and mutual respect. This topic illustrates how these values play out in society and also how they can sometimes clash. The topic also underpins a variety of topics as students move into the GCSE in Year 10, where these issues will be considered in more depth.</p>
