Overarching Topic: L'école			
<p>Why is this topic being studied at this time?</p> <p>How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?</p>	<p>By term 3 French Y7 students will be more adept at manipulating the language they have learnt to be more independent and again we teach them a very relatable topic – school. Being able to describe their own world in another language is empowering and engaging – pupils <u>want</u> to give their opinions on the subjects that they learn and the people who surround them for the majority of their time. Being able to describe their lives both inside and outside of school enables them to give a fuller picture of themselves.</p> <p>At RWS we look again at other French-speaking cultures and pupils can learn about the similarities and differences between British and French-speaking schools. This topic also offers students the opportunity to explore social issues in developing countries in the francophone world.</p> <p>In this final term of Y7, students begin to use longer sequences of language, developing their ability to narrate events, as we revisit and build on basic skills, grammar and vocabulary they have been learning in Terms 1 &amp; 2. Being able to produce language like this in a foreign language is both empowering and fun! To give an even fuller picture of their lives, students build on basic description by expressing and justifying opinions, a key skill which they will continue to develop throughout their language learning experience. This builds their general oracy and confidence in themselves.</p>
