Overarching Topic: Holidays			
Why is this topic being studied at this time? How does it fit into the wider subject curriculum?	Pupils will now set about consolidating all the knowledge and skills they have acquired over the Year 9 course whilst at the same time learning about to talk about how to talk about holidays in more detail in German. The term and the year will end with pupils being able to express themselves in the present and future tense (including the conditional) as well as the past tense – both perfect and imperfect.

(for example, German 'k' = English 'c', German 'b' = English 'v') Can I talk and write about customs and traditions?	Do I use connectives and time phrases regularly in <u>all</u> my written and spoken responses? Do I include present, past and future tense sentences in all responses (where appropriate)? Can I understand (old and contemporary) literary texts in German that use imperfect tense? Can I use the imperfect tense in addition to the perfect?
