HOW TO SIGN UP:

Please note that some clubs require mandatory payments due to the cost of specialist equipment or materials – for example, **Scuba Club** and **Cookery Club**. In addition, students selected to represent the school on our **sports teams** will be asked to pay a **yearly subscription** to support training and competition costs.

Enrolment for most clubs can be made easily through **ParentPay**. Many of our clubs are **free of charge**, but we kindly ask families to consider making a **voluntary contribution of up to £10** to help us continue to expand and improve the enrichment programme. This donation is entirely optional and can also be selected via ParentPay.


Off-Cut Engineers STEM Club



RWS Medical Futures


Open to: **Year 10, 11** and **Year 12** students interested in applying for Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry at University.

We are looking for enthusiastic Year 8 & 9 students who want to explore Science beyond the curriculum. This is a free weekly lunchtime club where students will be undertaking the Salter's Chemistry Challenge online - please note this is an opportunity to learn about different science topics not taught in lessons and is not a practical based club.

You will work towards a certificate to show you have completed the challenge!

The course is internationally recognised and leads to the Open Water Qualification with PADI.

Cost: £515—This includes all the online course, kit hire and pool sessions, each participant gets a mask and snorkel for them to keep (Value £70). Payment details on ParentPay

The planned dates for **2026** are Pool sessions **29**th **April and 6**th **of May**, these last about 3 hours each.

The proposed dates for the qualifying dives are the 9th and 10th of May 2026.

During the pool sessions (possibly in Lewisham) you will be taught the skills required, i.e. sorting out your buoyancy, recovering your mask, clearing our mask, communications, and signals. These will take place in the evening, therefore not affecting lessons.

To be able to take part you will also need to swim 200m unaided, while there is no time limit on this it is essential you are able to do so. It might be wise to do some training to help you prepare. If you are unable to complete this, you will not be allowed to proceed.

The dates for the qualifying lake sessions are set out above, we will be travelling there by minibus, pupils will need to provide their own lunch etc for the day, during these sessions they will be given opportunities to implement the skills they have learnt to become qualified open water divers.


The lake sessions require a cash payment on the day of £15 so £30 for the two qualifying dates. This will be collected on the day. We are using the mini busses to transport pupils there and back.

Optional $-\frac{1}{4}$ zip top at approx £35 each, this is an additional cost. These will be made available on parent pay as a separate item. These can be used for PE as well.

To take part and get the course material released we need the following deposit paid of £150. (paid via ParentPay)

Futsal (in conjunction with South London Inspire Futsal Club)

Futsal is 5-a-side football played with a low-bounce ball on a hard surface. Futsal players are constantly placed in situations where they must receive or play while under pressure or in confined spaces. It therefore places considerable demand on technique, movement, tactical awareness and fitness. The sport is a great skill developer as it demands quick reflexes, fast thinking and pin-point passing. Sessions will take place on the outdoor playground or in the gymnasium when possible.



Outdoor Club

Our outdoor programme at Ravens Wood is designed to allow students to participate in a wide range of experiences in different environments both within the UK and abroad.

Lower school students are offered the outdoor club during Years 7 & 8 where students will be supported to learn a variety of skills, including basic navigation, compass and map work, first aid and self-care in the outdoors. They will also learn fire lighting, basic camp cooking and other bushcraft skills that will build their confidence and instil a love of the outdoors.

As students move through the school, they will have the opportunity to participate in the DofE Award Scheme, starting with the Bronze award in Year 10. They will have the offer of exciting bespoke trips, such as our Arctic expedition to Finland, where we learn cross country skiing, build snow shelters and ice fishing as well as learning Arctic survival from experts.




