We are immensely proud of the 19 young men who represented Ravens Wood with such determination, teamwork, and sportsmanship. Special thanks go to their dedicated coach, Mr Begam, whose leadership and commitment have been instrumental in the team's success.



Year 12 have had a busy few weeks since half term with our Academic Review Week, Geography Field Trips, Cern Trip, University Visits, Careers Fair and our Next Steps evening. We understand that University is not for everyone so we aim to signpost alternative pathways and give students a variety of options to explore.

The year 9B football team has travelled far and wide this season, meeting some of the strongest schools on their run to the England Schools FA National final.

The home semi final saw us up against last year's National Champions, a team we had lost to in the quarter final. Revenge was in the air and the support of year 9 was ringing out down Oakley Road. The support was rewarded when Will Thompson smashed in a free kick from almost the half way line.



Early in the second half, Richard Hale School equalised against the run of play, until it looked like Jack Sullivan had won it with a fantastic finish, however in the last 2 minutes we were pegged back again and a fantastic save from Dillon Dewer meant extra time; penalties were looming until Sullivan relentlessly hunted down the centre back sprinted and poked the ball past the onrushing Richard Hale School goalkeeper, before the ball had even reached the net, delirium ensued and 300+ black and green clad supporters screamed in unison, the noise echoing around the 3G and across Bromley. Year 9B were through to the final of the England Schools FA National Cup Final!



The team prepared well for weeks, working on all aspects of their game, even penalty shootouts, to ensure that no stone was left unturned in pursuit of the title. This preparation included staying over night before the game at a 450 year old Manor House; this was a perfect base to plan the next day.

As we got to West Bromwich Albion FC, the noise from the game before us was deafening, our boys had done all the preparation and were ready, but nerves began to filter through the atmosphere.





We then saw the opposition and it was game faces on, and a walk from the dark shadow of the tunnel into the glorious Midlands sunshine. Our students, adorned in green shirts with black trim, looked the part and ready for battle.



This reprieve was short lived as the pressure from the Liverpudlians grew, and Evan Verghese had to make a number of fantastic cover tackles. One of these resulted in a corner, and the Cardinal Heenan centre back climbed highest to head in the opener. 1-0 down.

Halftime was now key, some tactical tweaks and motivation to rouse a positive response. With those messages in their ears, the boys in black and green came out fighting, and took full control of the game. Charlie Inglis hit a ferocious half volley that forced an unbelievable save from the goalkeeper, and it started to look like it might be one of those days for RWS.



The first chance fell to RWS with Captain, Sonny Langley Singh pouncing on a loose ball in the box and firing goalwards to only be denied by the post.

Shortly after, Cardinal Heenan, from Liverpool, dressed in red, delivered the first blow, a counter attack leading to a last gasp tackle adjudged to be a foul in the penalty area. Penalty Cardinal Heenan. Max Earwicker, in goal first half, guessed correctly and with a strong hand kept the ball out! Still 0-0.



This sparked RWS into life and the confidence in the passing game was evident, in the 29th minute the team received a free kick 25 yards out, a perfect opportunity to try a set piece they had learnt 3 days before, it was executed to perfection, with Freddie Watkinson providing the most perfect assist for Dan Henderson to head home! 1-1. Celebrations were cut short when the linesman's flag was raised and the equaliser chalked off.



And with 9 minutes to go, the Cardinal Heenan centre forward went running clean through and smashed a shot towards the top corner, it could have been done, it was a monumental moment in the game, but the save from Dillon Dewar, just like in the semi final, kept RWS in the tie.

With time running out and the game slipping away, it would have been easy for the boys to give up on each other; yet these moments seem to galvanise this group. And with 3 minutes to go upon regaining possession in midfield, the boys calmly started to build another assault on the Cardinal Heenan goal. Sam Graney, playing a forward pass to Langley Singh, a neat one, then two through midfield with Inglis, created time and space for Langley Singh to play a perfectly weighted through ball to Sullivan's perfectly timed run, the first time finish with his left foot a thing of beauty! 1-1!

The time expired with the sides unable to be separated, that meant one thing, penalties.









Langley Singh won the toss and chose to shoot first, as all good captains do, he took the responsibility of the first spot kick and scored, Dewar in bright pink was calm and poised, he chose the correct way and made the save, 1-0 RWS after one pen each.

Inglis made the walk up in confident manner and dispatched the best penalty in the whole shootout, 2-0. Dewar went the wrong way and we were pegged back 2-1.

Freddie Watkinson, who has never missed a penalty, was next up and kept his nerve sending the keeper the wrong way. 3-1.

Dewar again could not keep out their next pen. 3-2.

Will Thompson, kept to his word from the night before and went right down the middle, seeing the keeper dive out the way 4-2, no room for error for Cardinal Heenan and their 4th taker aimed for top corner, his shot missed the target and the England Schools FA National Cup was heading to Oakley Road!!!






YEAR 12 ART, FILM & MICHARY THROUGH NEW YORK CITY

Then we set off for a walk across the historic Brooklyn Bridge, offering breath-taking views of Manhattan's skyline. To end the day, we were honoured to attend a dynamic two-hour workshop at the New York Film Academy, led by talented instructors Jose Venutolo and Arsenio Assin. GERMAN EXCHANGE

We are pleased to announce that we hope to be able to offer the **German Exchange Trip** again next academic year to pupils in **years 8, 9, and 10 who study German** as an academic subject at Ravens Wood.

Withdrawal of the 654 Bus Route

I am writing to update you following the public consultation held between, Monday 27 January 2025 and Sunday 09 March 2025, <u>proposing changes to the bus service for route 654</u>. We received 83 responses to the consultation and would like to thank everyone that took part.

Our proposal was to permanently withdraw the school bus route 654.

Our decision

Following careful consideration of the consultation responses and a further review of what was proposed, we have decided to proceed with these proposals as set out in the consultation.

The money saved will allow us to better use our limited resources; operating a more efficient bus service helps us make financial savings that can be reinvested in other parts of the London bus network, including in areas where there is not enough bus capacity to meet customer needs.

Today we have published our <u>consultation report</u> which confirms this decision. The report also includes our response to the key issues raised, including concerns related to capacity and reliability of other local bus routes and concerns that journey times will be longer.

Next steps

We intend to make the bus service changes during July 2025, with the **654-bus service stopping operating after the end of the 2024/25 academic year**. Customer information will be issued in advance of any changes to ensure customers are aware.

Once the changes are implemented, as part of our continual review of the London bus network, our monitoring will continue to ensure services match passenger demand.


