The evening, though very hot, was filled with warmth in more ways than one — from the lively atmosphere to the heartfelt speeches and shared moments of pride.





YOUNG SOLDIST OF THE YEAR

The final of this year's Young Soloist of the Year competition took place last Thursday in a tense yet electric atmosphere, as 11 outstanding live finalists—and a first-ever video submission—gathered to showcase their musical talents. The standard was incredibly high, and the anticipation was palpable throughout the room.

It was a truly celebratory evening of music, demonstrating not only technical skill but also a wide spectrum of musical expression. From the quirky charm of the Wallace and Gromit theme to the intensity of My Chemical Romance, and from the sophistication of Duke Ellington to the soaring vocals of Sam Ryder, the programme was as diverse as it was impressive. Each performer handled the pressure with professionalism, poise, and passion.

The judging panel consisted of Mr. Bamping and two distinguished guest judges from Trinity Laban Conservatoire: Ms. Christina Minton and Mrs. Isabelle Gray. Christina also delivered an inspiring speech about forging your own path in music—"the road less travelled"—and treated the audience to a stunning Bach violin solo. The judges were unanimous in their praise of the students, highlighting the maturity of performance and admirable stage presence on display.





Adam in 10A took home the title of Young Soloist of the Year with his explosive and expertly executed rendition of Iron Maiden's The Trooper. His win was wholly deserved, capturing the spirit of individuality and musical risk-taking. Other awards included the Endeavour Award, given to Lewis in 9A, and the Aspire Prize, awarded to Kayden 7D.

Our winner Adam later revealed that he was moving from this final to playing two gigs with his band, The Bandanas, over the weekend making it a heavy finish to the week with 3 performances in 4 days.

The evening proved that musical talent at the school is thriving across every year group—from those just beginning their journey to those with ambitions to go professional. It was a night to remember and a fitting celebration of the joy, discipline, and brilliance that music brings to our community.

YEAR 12 TRIP TO





Year 12 students visited the Large Hadron Collider at CERN as well as the Headquarters of the Red Cross to enhance and broaden their learning opportunities. As part of the visit, we had several Physicists talk to the group, explaining aspects of what they do, this was then followed by a visit to the source of the world wide web (which was started at CERN and continues to be supported there).







Students also had the opportunity to visit the antimatter factory where they are producing antihydrogen. We are still unclear how antihydrogen will behave; it is however an exciting prospect to deliver future energy needs.

SOUTH COAST SURVEYS



In recent weeks Ravens Wood Geographers have been busy collecting data out in the field.

160 Yr. 10 Geographers visited Newhaven and Rottingdean on the South coast. They were investigating whether longshore drift was active at Newhaven West Beach and evaluating the coastal defences at Rottingdean. The trip gave a valuable insight into fieldwork techniques and key case studies which will be examined in their GCSE examination.















Our 55 Yr 12 Geographers have tested a range of hypotheses' across a variety of the finest locations the South East of England can offer. This included the impact of the Turner Gallery and Dreamland on the regeneration of Margate, coastal processes and an evaluation of the effectiveness of defences at Reculver, contrasting regeneration strategies at London Docklands with the new Kings Cross initiative through to sand dune succession at Camber Sands.

We are proud of the works our students have carried out and the resilience they have shown in some challenging weather conditions. We look forward to seeing how the students utilise the skills and knowledge gained when answering examination questions and completing their NEA's.

Withdrawal of the 654 Bus Route

I am writing to update you following the public consultation held between, Monday 27 January 2025 and Sunday 09 March 2025, <u>proposing changes to the bus service for route 654</u>. We received 83 responses to the consultation and would like to thank everyone that took part.

Our proposal was to permanently withdraw the school bus route 654.

Our decision

Following careful consideration of the consultation responses and a further review of what was proposed, we have decided to proceed with these proposals as set out in the consultation.

The money saved will allow us to better use our limited resources; operating a more efficient bus service helps us make financial savings that can be reinvested in other parts of the London bus network, including in areas where there is not enough bus capacity to meet customer needs.

Today we have published our <u>consultation report</u> which confirms this decision. The report also includes our response to the key issues raised, including concerns related to capacity and reliability of other local bus routes and concerns that journey times will be longer.

Next steps

We intend to make the bus service changes during July 2025, with the **654-bus service stopping operating after the end of the 2024/25 academic year**. Customer information will be issued in advance of any changes to ensure customers are aware.

Once the changes are implemented, as part of our continual review of the London bus network, our monitoring will continue to ensure services match passenger demand.


