Dear Parent/Carer,

I hope that all members of our Ravens Wood community enjoyed a restful and enjoyable half-term break.

Although half term provided a break from the classroom for many, a number of our students enjoyed exceptional learning opportunities abroad. Our Art and Media students travelled to New York, immersing themselves in one of the world's most vibrant cultural and creative capitals. The trip provided invaluable experiences, inspiration and memories that will undoubtedly enrich their studies. At the same time, our Physics students visited CERN, the European organisation for Nuclear Research, where they gained first-hand insight into some of the most groundbreaking scientific research taking place anywhere in the world. These experiences are truly transformative for our students, and I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the staff who generously gave up their half-term break to accompany and support our students on these visits.

Over the past two weeks, GCSE and A Level examinations have continued. I have been impressed by the maturity, resilience and commitment shown by our students throughout the examination season.

On Friday 5th June, we held our annual Year 11 Shirt Signing celebration. It was wonderful to see students enjoying this important milestone together before continuing to focus on their examinations.

Our Year 12 students have taken part in 'Feedback Fortnight', where they have met individually with subject teachers to review their progress, celebrate successes and identify clear targets for improvement. These conversations are a valuable part of our commitment to ensuring every student understands their strengths and the next steps needed to achieve their ambitions as they prepare for the challenges and opportunities of Year 13.

On Thursday 4th June, our Sixth Form team hosted a highly successful UCAS Next Steps Event. The evening provided students and families with invaluable guidance on university applications, personal statements and future pathways. The excellent feedback received reflects the dedication and expertise of the staff involved, and I would like to thank everyone who contributed to making the event such a success.

On the same day, we celebrated a number of our younger students who had achieved the prestigious Headteacher's Award. It was a pleasure to recognise their outstanding efforts, commitment and contribution to school life. These awards exemplify the Black and Green values that sit at the heart of our school community.

Our assemblies have also provided students with valuable opportunities for reflection and learning. Last week, Miss Prescott, Deputy Headteacher, led assemblies recognising Environment Day and this week, Ms Rennalls, Assistant Headteacher, delivered assemblies exploring Healthy Eating. I was also delighted to attend the Houses of Parliament on Monday 8th June alongside Miss McKenzie, Director of Wellbeing and Personal Development, and Miss Brown, Head of Citizenship and PSHE, for the UK Feminista Awards Ceremony. I am incredibly proud to share that Ravens Wood School was one of only two schools in the country to receive the Gold Award, in recognition of our commitment to addressing positive attitudes towards gender equality. This prestigious national recognition reflects the dedication, passion and hard work of many staff and students across our school community. # Above and Beyond Awards



Immanuel in 10D, who was nominated for his success in Jujitsu, and coming 3rd in the Jujitsu Junior Nationals competition, gaining a medal on the podium.



Charlie in 11B, who was nominated in recognition of his diving skills - Charlie won silver in the National skills completion finals representing London in 2025



Karina in 12D, who was nominated for being chosen to do some really exciting work with the graphics for the David Bowie project. Karina has received this not only because of her evident talent, but because she is so brilliantly immersed in school life and all the amazing wider opportunities it brings her.



Albie in 9A, who was nominated due to his continued motorsport success, and most recently in the FIA Academy Trophy Competition, finishing P3 in Valencia. Albie is very proud to be driving for Great Britain having been selected by Motorsport UK. Round 2 will be in Mulsen, Germany, next month.



During the 2025 season, Harrison in 11A competed in Junior Rotax karting championships with several notable successes, including: Buckmore Park Championship - 2 race wins and 3 podium finishes,

In 2026, Harrison became the BM Plate Club Champion at Bayford Meadows.

He is currently competing nationally in the NKC (National Kart Cup) with NexGen Motorsports, racing at circuits across the UK against highly competitive fields. At the most recent round at Rowrah, Harrison achieved his best finish of 4th place in a grid of approximately 70 drivers. Harrison has also competed in three rounds of the BMKR Championship this season, achieving two podium finishes so far.

It is also worth mentioning that all of these achievements have been accomplished without factory team support or a professional team set-up, making his results even more rewarding given the level of competition. This has required significant commitment, preparation, resilience, and dedication alongside balancing his GCSE studies.

Rory in 11E, who is currently 3rd in this season's UK under 18 hammer throw rankings with a personal best of 59 meters 20 cm. However, unlike the two athletes currently above him who are in Year 12, he has another year left in the same age group and so is currently number one in the UK for his school year, crowned English national champion in the UK athletics Winter Long Throws Championship in Loughborough with a winning distance of 57m34



Leon in 11A, who was nominated as he is a member of the London Schools' Symphony Orchestra, as principal percussionist and Timpanist. Leon also attends a centre for young musicians, and has performed at the Barbican Centre, St Alfege Church in Greenwich, St John the Divine in Kennington, the Great Hall at Goldsmiths, and worked with distinguished conductors and internationally respected musicians.



# RAVENS WOOD SCHOOL ACHIEVES NATIONAL GOLD AWARD

We are delighted to celebrate Ravens Wood School's outstanding achievement in being awarded the prestigious **Gold UK Feminista Action Award**.

The UK Feminista Action Award recognises schools and colleges that have demonstrated exceptional commitment to tackling sexism and sexual harassment through a whole-school approach. Ravens Wood was one of only **two schools nationally** to achieve the Gold Award this year, placing us amongst the leading schools in the country for this important work.

In recognition of this achievement, Headteacher Ms. Lester, Director of Wellbeing and Personal Development Miss McKenzie, and PSHE Lead Miss Brown were invited to attend a special awards ceremony at the Houses of Parliament, where awards were presented by Helen Hayes MP, Chair of the Education Select Committee.

Ravens Wood was also invited to address delegates at the national event, with Ms. Lester and Miss McKenzie sharing the school's work on promoting equality, challenging sexism and creating a culture of respect. They spoke about the importance of listening to student and staff voice, strengthening curriculum provision, developing healthy masculinity, and ensuring robust systems are in place to challenge discrimination and support all members of the school community.

This national recognition reflects the dedication and commitment of students, staff and leaders across the school. Over recent years, Ravens Wood has worked hard to embed a culture where respect, equality and inclusion are central to school life. Through our curriculum, personal development programme, student leadership opportunities and wider school initiatives, we continue to equip young people with the knowledge, confidence and values needed to contribute positively to society.

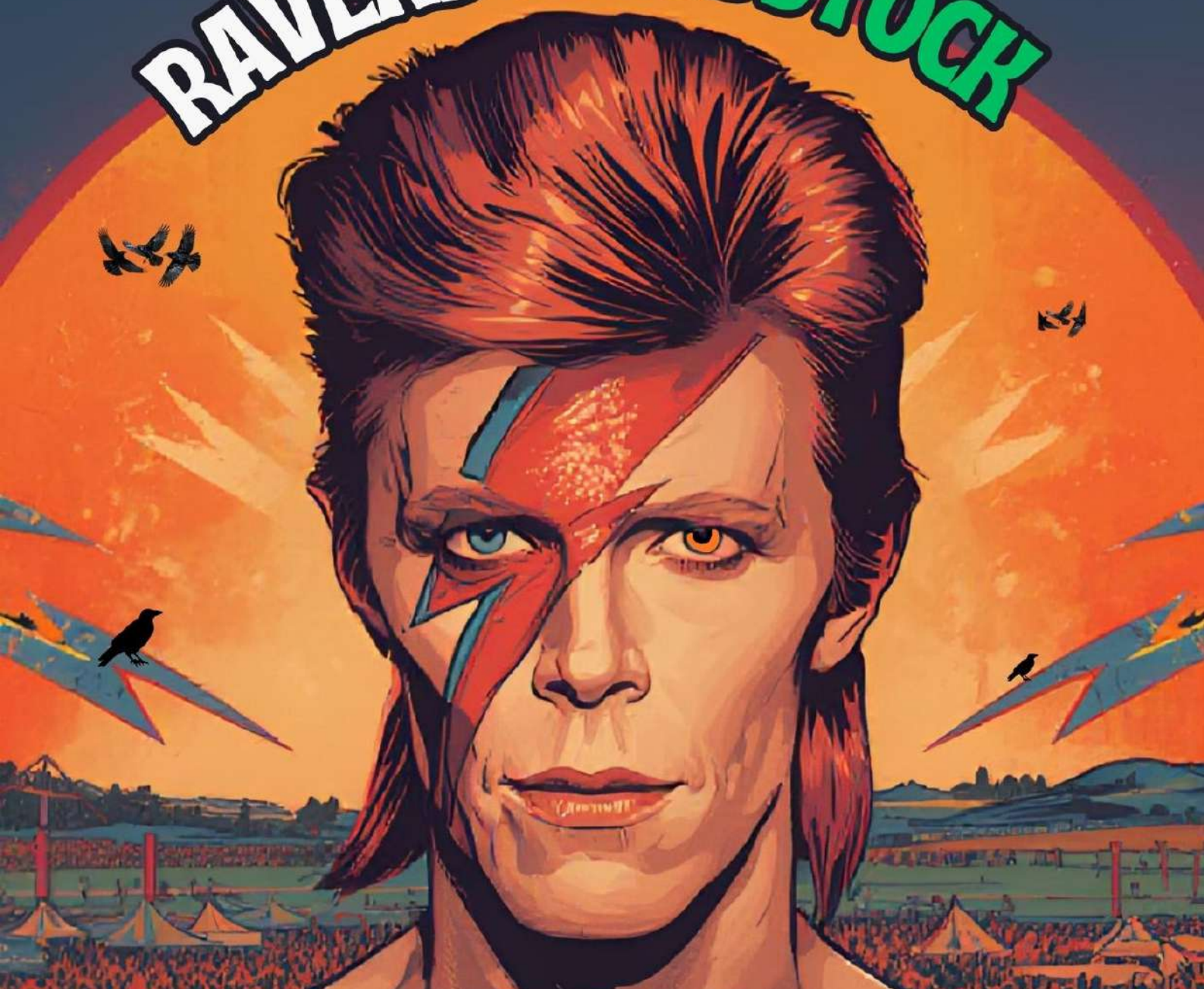

## HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD

Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

**CHEST:** Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing tape close up under the arms.

**COLLAR:** Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth.

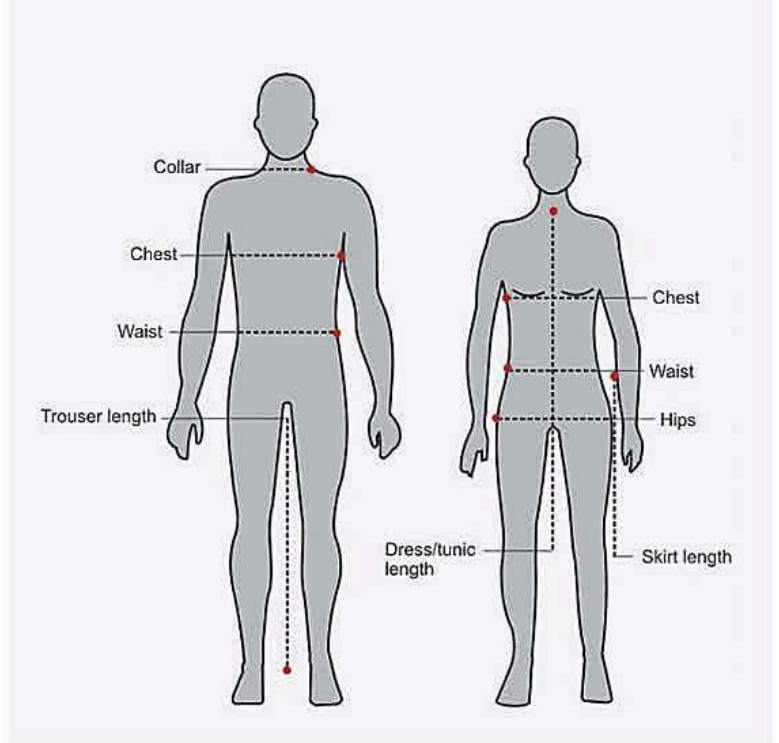
**WAIST:** Measure around the natural waistline.

**TROUSER LENGTH:** Measure the inside leg from crotch to floor without shoes on.

**HIPS:** Measure around the hips, 20cm (8") below the natural waistline.

**SKIRT LENGTH:** Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hem.

**DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH:** Measure from nape of neck to length required.

# IMPORTANT WASH CARE INSTRUCTIONS



Always refer to your garment care label to ensure that your uniform looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough, hardwearing uniform, however it is important that you follow the care labels correctly to ensure you get the best out of your purchase.

- Turn garments inside out to wash and dry
- Fasten any buttons before washing
- Do not overload machine
- Iron inside out on a cool setting to avoid heat damage, which can cause a shiny surface on fabrics (do not iron knitwear or cuffs and welts on sweatshirts)
- Bobbling/Pilling is caused by friction and excessive heat. It is also known within the British textile industry that fabric softeners are a major cause of bobbling/pilling of the fabric. Bobbling/pilling often disappears over time and is not a reflection on the quality of the garment.
