Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to our first Newsletter of the academic year; I am delighted to welcome our students back to Ravens Wood School. We hope you've had a restful summer and are ready for an exciting year ahead. A special welcome goes out to our new Year 7 students and their families, who are joining us for the first time. They have had a very successful first week with us and settled well. A special welcome also goes to our new Year 12 cohort, both returning Year 11 students and those joining us from other schools. We are very pleased you have chosen to study at Ravens Wood and to have you as part of our community.

This summer, we celebrated our students' achievements in both A Level and GCSE examinations. We were pleased to be celebrating a fantastic set of A Level and BTEC results for 2024. Over 220 students achieved more than 560 grades, with 17% of A Level grades awarded at A*-A, 42% at A*-B, and 73% at A*-C. The overall A Level pass rate was an impressive 99%. Our BTEC students also excelled, with just under a third of all grades being Distinction* or Distinction, and a 100% pass rate.

Our GCSE students also made us proud. Despite the challenges faced during their early secondary school years due to Covid-19, they have risen to the occasion and achieved results significantly above the national average for boys. In total, over 360 grades awarded across various subjects were 9-7, including 42 grades 9-7 in English and 40 in Maths.

We are incredibly proud of all our students; their results are a testament to their hard work, resilience, and commitment to success. We wish our Year 13 leavers the best of luck as they embark on the next stages of their education and careers, and we look forward to supporting our new A Level students as they begin the next stage of their educational journey. A huge thanks goes to the wonderful Ravens Wood staff for their hard work and dedication in ensuring all students reach their maximum potential.

Over the summer, our school has undergone several significant improvements. These include roofing works in the maths block, an updated and improved staff room, a revamped Pupil Development Department, and totally refurbished toilet facilities for all (see page 6 of this newsletter). We appreciate the patience of our staff and students as the final touches to these projects are completed.

As we move forward into the new academic year, we are excited to work closely with our students and families. Thank you for your ongoing support of Ravens Wood School. Let's make this year a successful and memorable year for all.

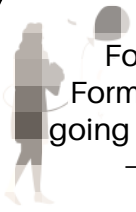

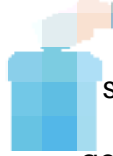
Ms Simmons

Mr Grant has been busy working voluntarily on AV projects for the academic year 2023-24 – this work is above and beyond.



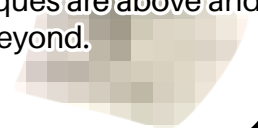
