LONDON SOUTH EAST COLLEGES

Educational Visits

On 6th December, a group of 15 students from RWS11 went on a visit to Bromley College. This was to give them an insight into the courses that Bromley (part of London South East Colleges) offer post 16, once they have completed their GCSEs. We had a good look around the different areas of the college -in particular the practical courses that interested the students, such as Motor Vehicle, Electrical, Plumbing, Carpentry and Bricklaying. We also bumped into some ex students who were busy working on their Level 1 and Level 2 courses, and were able to give some first-hand feedback to our current students looking to follow in their footsteps.

Imperial College London

On Wednesday 6th December a group of 15 year 12 STEM students had a trip to Imperial College London to hear about some of the exciting courses they run and to have a tour of the campus. Due to a change of travel plans, we arrived in early and took full advantage of the close proximity to the Natural History Museum. The students had 50mins for a whistle stop tour of the Museum, including a chance to stand in the Earthquake room and where Ms Winter got to build her own arachnid. Arriving at Imperial College, we were shown into the lecture theatre where we first listened to an interactive lecture on Bioengineering, contrary to popular belief you did not actually have to study Biology to access the course. Students had hands on experience of looking at knee and hip joints as well as prosthetic legs.

Then we listened to a lecture on Physics and in particular focussing on the Sun and its surface. Likening the Sun to a pot of boiling tomato soup, we found out that some of the Sun Spots seen on the surface are bigger than the Earth and can eject radiation that could wipe out communication on Earth and affect all electronics. The final lecture was on Material Science where using ideas that nature has already perfected, we looked at how this could be applied to practical ideas like Geko Tape which while easy to peel off substances was impossible to remove when two surfaces where stuck together.

Also investigating the fact that iridescent colours in nature are not real colours, but due to the construction of the feathers and how this applies to making iridescent materials also grabbed the students attention.

We completed the day with a tour of the campus and with the students contemplating areas of STEM that they had not previously thought about. Mrs Bristow and Ms Winter.

German Exchange



A group of 15 Year 8 to 10 students have just returned from a successful German Exchange trip to Leer in Ostfriesland.

Whilst there, they had the opportunity to experience lessons in a German school and to learn about the important trading history of Leer and its relationship with England. Alpaca and llama trekking introduced everybody to the bracing (and damp!) East Frisian countryside, whilst a trip to Oldenburg with their exchange partners allowed the students to take in the sights, sounds, smells and, yes, tastes of a proper German Christmas Market.

Students commented about the trip:

"I learnt independence and lots of new vocabulary."

"I met lots of new friends."

"I would recommend the trip as it's good life experience and you get to visit new places."



e-scooters and the law

Under Government regulations, e-scooters are classed as 'powered transporters' – a term used to cover a variety of novel and emerging personal transport devices which are powered by a motor.

This means they are treated as a motor vehicle and subject to the same legal requirements such as MOT, licensing, tax and insurance.

As e-scooters don't have number plates, signal ability and don't always have a visible rear light, they can't be used legally on the roads.

Their use is also <u>prohibited</u> on cycle lanes and pavements.

e-scooters are currently only legal to ride on:
- private land with the landowner's permission,
or

- as part of a Government trial rental scheme, which Bromley is <u>not</u> part of.

Any illegal e-scooters stopped by the Police can be seized, and riders can be fined in excess of £300.

Dear parent / guardian,

As we enter the winter and holiday season, it is important to be aware that viruses such as flu circulate more during this time and are especially common in young children. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness in children, some may even need to go to hospital for treatment, including intensive care.

It's not too late for your child to have their flu vaccine this year, if they missed it in school, please contact the Bromley School Age Immunisation Team on 0203 903 3375 or by email on: Hrch.ImmunisationTeamBromleyMailbox@nhs.net, up until the end of January 2024.

There are some concerns that have been voiced by parents about the nasal flu vaccine, so we thought to provide some information to commonly asked questions below:

Safety of the vaccine:

The nasal flu vaccine is offered to all children each year, it contains a live attenuated (weakened) influenza virus which helps protect against influenza infection in those who receive it. Over 25 million doses of the nasal spray have now been given in the UK and it has an excellent safety profile. All vaccines go through a regulatory approval process to ensure they meet strict safety and effectiveness checks

Effectiveness of the vaccine:

The vaccine is highly effective and studies have shown a 93% reduction in hospital admissions due to confirmed influenza and a 94% reduction in GP consultations for influenza-like illness in primary school children. The vaccine also reduces the chance of children spreading the flu to others who could be at greater risk of flu, such as grandparents or those with long term health conditions.

Exposure to virus from the vaccine:

A very small dose of vaccine fluid (around 1/50th of a teaspoon) is given in each nostril. No 'mist' of vaccine virus escapes into the air and therefore other people in the room are not at risk of "catching" the vaccine virus. During the extensive use of the vaccine over many years in the UK, no transmission of the vaccine virus from the nasal spray has been reported to date.

Shedding of vaccine virus in those vaccinated:

Although vaccinated children do shed a small amount of vaccine virus for a few days after vaccination, the virus does not survive for long outside of the body and the dose is below that normally needed to infect others. There is no need for any child or staff member to be excluded from school during the period when the nasal flu vaccine is being offered or in the following weeks. This is in contrast to natural flu infection, which spreads easily during

the flu season. In schools where most children are vaccinated the overall risk from influenza virus is massively reduced. Children with immune problems, and their siblings and family contacts, should themselves be vaccinated, usually with an injected (inactivated) vaccine




