## **Tasks**

1. Download a copy of the OCR specification from:

https://ocr.org.uk/qualifications/as-and-a-level/history-a-h105-h505-from-2015/

- 2. Please read through the specification. Our topics are:
  - a. Unit Group 1 Y113, Britain 1930–1997 (Enquiry topic: Churchill 1930–1951)
  - b. Unit Group 2 Y223, The Cold War in Europe 1941-1995
  - c. Unit Group 3 Y306, Rebellion and Disorder under the Tudors, 1485-1603.
- 3. Create a detailed CV for Churchill up to May 1940 this should be no more than 2 sides of A4. This should include Churchill's views on rearmament and appearament. Please focus on the significance of Churchill's views and the issues that he would prioritise.
- 4. Create a timeline of all British Prime Ministers from David Lloyd-George to Tony Blair. Make sure that you include: what party they represented; what general elections they stood in; what their majorities were. Make sure that you pay close attention to your research here as there were periods of coalitions and minority governments!
- 5. Prepare 1 side of A-4 notes (size 12, Times New Roman) on the Yalta and Potsdam meetings. You should focus on: details regarding the most positive outcomes; details regarding the most negative and divisive issues; details on those issues that were left unresolved.
- 6. Create a timeline of Tudor monarchs from Henry VII through to Elizabeth you need to include the dates of their reigns.
- 7. Your work should be typed and, in a folder, ready for use next year. Be prepared to verbally present your findings within the first week.
