



Dear Parent/Carer,

It has been a busy two weeks since our last newsletter, with a variety of activities and events taking place across the school.

Firstly, we have had assemblies led by our senior leaders focusing on the European Day of Languages, why communication is so important and how languages link to our school values and celebrating Black History Month and standing up to racism, both of which took place over the past two weeks.

On Saturday 21st September, we were delighted to welcome over 1800 visitors to the school for our annual open morning. During their visit, Governors toured the school, observed students in their Ready to Learn sessions at the start of the day, and saw the summer works completed, including our new bathroom facilities for both staff and students. Our Year 12 students attended a team-building event on Friday 27th September. Despite the wet weather, their team spirit shone through, and they had a fantastic trip. 
Silent Study Masterclass



The Science department would like to extend our congratulations to a group of Y9 and Y10 students who independently submitted successful applications to the Kent and Medway Virtual Medical School this Autumn. We are extremely proud of them!

The students visited the Kent and Medway campus on Saturday 28th September for a launch event and have since started their first online lessons. A massive well done to Ali and Kenan in Year 9, Dominic, Andrew, Aaron, Leon, Shrey and Ohene in Year 10!

'Attending the launch of the Kent Medway Virtual Medical Society was an incredible experience. We had the opportunity to use real ultrasound imaging equipment, exploring how it is used in diagnosis. It was fascinating to see the technology in action and understand how essential it is in patient care. We also used traditional sphygmomanometers and stethoscopes to measure blood pressure manually. Although it seemed tricky at first to listen for the heartbeat and gauge the pressure, it felt rewarding once I got the hang of it.

Overall, the day was an enriching dive into the world of medicine, and it gave me a clearer sense of what it would be like to pursue a career in healthcare.' - Kenan, Year 9

Troy is making big strides

Gillingham academy striker Troy Ogedengbe has talent on the field- and on the track. The club's under-15 player-who stands at an impressive eft 3in- has been combining his footballing ability with performances as a top young sprinter.

Ogedengbe, who competes for Blackheath & Bromley Harriers Athletics Club, won both Kent County and Kent County School competitions over 200m and represented Kent Schools in the English Schools Championships where he took fifth place in the 200m final. His athletic prowess was on display again in the recent Southern Areas Inter Counties

display again in the recent Southern Areas Inter Counties Competition earlier this month, claiming a secondplaced 200m finish, despite being called up to play for Gillingham's under 16 team against Swindon the day before.

He qualified for the final, facing off against world record holder Divine Iheme, but Ogedengbe ran a fantastic race, clocking a personal best time of 22.9 isec.

His second-placed finish solidified his position as one of the UK's top under-15 200m runners.

With the athletics season now behind him, Ogedengbe will be turning his full focus to football with a goal of securing a spot in Gillingham's under 18 team




