


This term the members of the STEM Academy have been busy with the early stages of two projects we are running this year.




GEOGRAPHY URBAN FIELD WORK 2024

On the 8th and 10th of October, 150 Year 11 students conducted a field investigation in Stratford, East London, to assess the impact of the 2012 London Olympics on the local community. As part of the investigation, students visited three key locations: East Village/Olympic Village, Carpenter's Estate, and the Olympic Park. At each site, data was collected to evaluate and compare the levels of development and quality of life for residents. 




AUTISM ALERT CARD



Did you know that the Met and the National Police Autism Association has an **Autism Alert Card Scheme**? This card can be used by all autistic people and includes basic information such as the person's name and contact details for an appropriate adult. The card also details information about autism and provides practical advice for the officer. There is also an A5 sized booklet version of the card, which goes into more detail about how the officer should communicate with the person, including how to help the person and any relevant information about them. In addition to assisting autistic people engaging with officers, who could be struggling in an unexpected or emotional situation, the card can also assist officers in explaining why someone may be having difficulty communicating with them. You may like to inform pupils' parents and carers about this scheme. Applications can be made by members of the public by e-mailing: autism@met.police.uk.


